Ride My Road envisions a world free from commercial sexual exploitation and human trafficking.

Ride My Road empowers the motorcycle community and beyond to fight against human trafficking through fundraising and education.

Since 2016, Ride My Road has supported American survivors of human trafficking. Our fundraising efforts are dedicated to organizations led by survivors offering direct services to survivors.





our founder:

Lauren Trantham is the founder and executive director of Ride My Road. In 2016, Lauren started Ride My Road as a personal photography project to photograph American Survivors. Since that time, and in addition to photographing over 80 survivors, she has ridden tens of thousands of miles on her motorcycle raising hundreds of thousands of dollars for survivor-led organizations.

Ride My Road has continued to host national events, fundraisers, motorcycle giveaways, and more to fight human trafficking with a focus on educating and enrolling the motorcycle community to end human trafficking.



a letter from our founder



dear supporter,

The first time I met an American survivor of sex trafficking I couldn't stop thinking that, "she could be me". Her story was one that anyone could see themselves in.

Human Trafficking in the United States is a multi-billion dollar industry with victims of all ages, genders, and backgrounds caught in the middle. However, even though it feels like an overwhelming issue, there is hope!

trafficking worldwide:

With an estimated <u>24.9 million</u> victims worldwide at any given time, human traffickers prey on adults and children of all ages, backgrounds, and nationalities, exploiting them for their own profit.

trafficking in usa:


In the United States, traffickers compel victims to engage in commercial sex and to work in both legal and illicit industries and sectors, including in hospitality, traveling sales crews, agriculture, janitorial services, construction, landscaping, restaurants, factories, care for persons with disabilities, salon services, massage parlors, retail services, fairs and carnivals, peddling and begging, drug smuggling and distribution, religious institutions, child care, and domestic work.

"In 2020, 10,583 situations of human trafficking were reported to the U.S. National Human Trafficking Hotline involving 16,658 individual victims. Shocking as these numbers are, they are likely only a fraction of the actual problem." -Polaris Project, U.S. National Human Trafficking Hotline.

trafficking & covid:

The number of crisis trafficking cases handled by the Trafficking Hotline increased by more than <u>40 percent</u> in the month following the shelter-in-place orders compared to the prior month.

how we are fighting

our programs:

Disruptors University

In March of 2019, when the pandemic hit we were forced to cancel all our events nationwide. Suddenly, all our opportunities to reach the motorcycle community came to a halt. At the same time, reports were coming in that trafficking was increasing among vulnerable populations. We had to find a way to continue to educate the motorcycle community and beyond about the realities of trafficking in this difficult time.

In direct response to these new challenges, we created Disruptors University. We pivoted from inperson events to an online platform to provide top-level education and training to bikers and beyond so that they may be able to identify trafficking. Throughout the course, participants also learn to fundraise within their own communities.





Disruptors University is a 10-12 week online course. Disruptors (participants) meet once a week to learn from some of the top antitrafficking educators and survivor leaders in the country. Each educator presents on a facet of trafficking. By the end of the course, Disruptors are provided a well-rounded understanding of the nuances of human trafficking in America.

Survivor Portrait Sessions

In the summer of 2021 Lauren returned to the road, traveling through 8 states to photograph 30 survivors of human trafficking in the United States.

These photoshoots are a transformative experience and gift to survivors. Many survivors feel as though they carry their exploitation and trauma on their sleeves. A photoshoot allows them to see what we see; beauty, resiliency and strength.

Together we have given away four bikes and raised tens of thousands of dollars for survivors to attend restoration and educational programs.

The Hard Road Challenge

The Hard Road Challenge is a two-day physical challenge and fundraising event paying tribute to survivors of human trafficking. Ride My Road is honored to be the fundraising coordinator for this event hosted by our partners at The Epik Project.

The Epik Project specializes in disrupting the demand for commercial sexual exploitation at the point of sale and The Hard Road is their way of standing in solidarity with survivors by choosing to complete a difficult physical challenge.

22 Hard Road Challengers from across the country came together in 2021 to run, walk, hike, and bicycle to raise funds.











our 2021 impact







The Hard Road

The funds raised through our partnership with The Epik Project for The Hard Road Challenge were used to support survivor organizations as well as fund Epik's work to reduce the demand for commercial sexual exploitation. Of the \$31,000, \$16,500 were granted to The Avery Center, Relentless Pursuit (Christine's Place), Treassures LA and the Northwest Survivor Alliance. The remaining \$14,500 funded Epik's Cyber Patrols to engage with sex buyers at the point of purchase.

our 2021 impact, cont.





#Survivorbike

The funds raised from our 2021 motorcycle giveaway funded 10 survivors' full-tuition scholarships to The Elevate Academy. Elevate is the largest online school for survivors of human trafficking, offering courses in professional development, budgeting, business 101, finding a specialty, nonprofit management, public speaking training, social entrepreneurship, author support and more. Tuition is %100 free for survivors and our giveaway enabled 10 survivors to graduate from The Elevate Academy with skills and support to flourish after so much trauma.




Disruptors University

The funds raised from our 2021 Disruptors University inaugural cohort were used to support survivors in STEM and technical training. Of the \$11,000 raised, \$5,000 was granted to Annie Cannons to sponsor annual tuition for survivors to attend a year-long course in computer literacy, web development and app creation and coding. \$5,000 was also sent to The Avery Center for Research and Services to sponsor four survivors in the job development and employment program, including social media management training
